When a rescuer with good intentions abandoned 13 dogs, one tiny dog with a broken jaw died. Another had bladder stones. Many were missing most of their teeth. Poor Daisy was found in her crate floating down a creek and saved, but the rescuer could not find her a home. We took them all and sent them to new homes!

Almost every month this year we have responded to emergencies like this one involving lots and lots of dogs when no other group would take them. Many of these needed medical care, and two pregnant moms gave birth to premature puppies as we transferred them. If we had said, "NO," this entire group would have been euthanized immediately because like most rural areas there was no facility to hold them.

Plus, nearly all larger no kill shelters refuse all animals from outside their city or county. That's why we work hard to help rural areas, where most of the big abuse, neglect, hoarding, and breeder cases occur.



It's horrible seeing loving animals like these die when our partners in 47 states and Canada have wonderful homes waiting for them! Many will have homes the day they arrive at our group partners!
